My ancestors's services during the Revolutionary War were as follows:

Nathaniel Judson, a Revolutionary soldier with Washington on Long Island, Schuyler in Northern New York, a Yoman at the capture of St. Jons, Adjutant of the 4th Regiment of Connecticut Troops from May 1777 to November 1779 and in other positions to the end of the war.
